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the russian born artist sonia delaunay who with her husband robert delaunay was a leading light of the cubist splinter group orphism branched out after the first world war into a distinctive career of her own between 1920 and 1930 a decade full of activity and success she produced some of the most striking and original fabric designs of modern times she was the inventor of abstract design for fabrics and her materials brightly colored and filled with geometric patterns were the rage among fashionable circles in the art deco era delaunay made imaginative waistcoats for tristan tzara louis aragon rene crevel and other surrealist poets she dressed gloria swanson and various french film stars the unconventional socialite nancy cunard and the wife of the bauhaus architect marcel breuer she also designed interiors in collaboration with the paris architect mallet stevens and created costumes for the early films of marcel l herhier her fabrics were sold by liberty s in london and many of the most exclusive department stores in new york jean cocteau and blaise cendrars wrote about her fashion designs and her decorative scarves are known to have had an influence on the work of paul klee jacques damase the french publisher and art historian is intimately familiar with all of delaunay s original designs and fabric samples in many cases both the design and the sample still exist and this is the first time most of them have been photographed damase has written an appreciation of delaunay and has also assembled a representative selection of writings by her contemporary admirers and critics the result is a definitive record of this unusually talented artist s contribution to commercial design these dazzling exciting designs are artworks in themselves the fact that they had a practical purpose makes them even more admirable

modernism on stage restores the ballets russes to its central role in the parisian art world of the 1910s and 1920s and includes close readings of ballets designed by picasso delaunay matisse and de chirico dance is brought to bear upon modernist art history as more than a source of imagery but as part of the avant garde s articulation of the idea of a total work of art

impressions from paris studies the contributions of various women artists and writers who lived in paris during the interwar years from the 1920s to 1940 the roaring twenties constituted years of experimentation and freedom to test new techniques and lifestyles at a time affected by serious political changes leading to world war ii their trajectories have left traces that can be mapped out studied and addressed today a hundred years later the volume revisits their experiences through various lenses that include art history gender fashion literary analysis psychology philosophy as well as film and food the volume revisits the

artistic literary and journalistic contributions of women worldwide including france as they flocked to paris from the 1920s to 1940 the overall principle lies in the inclusion of female painters visual artists and writers from diverse international and national backgrounds scholars who participate in the volume explore the possibilities presented in a modern literary and artistic history while building on previous scholarship two seminal books and a documentary film inspire this project shari benstock's women of the left bank paris 1900 1940 texas up 1986 and andrea weiss's paris was a woman portraits from the left bank harpersanfrancisco 1995 which in turn produced an eponymous film greta schiller andrea weiss 1996 these works highlight the community of women artists editors and writers during the interwar years in paris there is scholarship in the area although most of it is scattered in single monographs crossing various genres and various languages from recent graphic novels to fiction biographical studies cultural histories as well as scholarly artistic and literary studies

this is the first bibliography in its field based on first hand collations of the actual articles international in scope it includes publications found in public theatre libraries and archives of barcelona berlin brussels budapest florence london milan new york and paris amongst others over 3500 detailed entries on separately published sources such as books sales and exhibition catalogues and pamphlets provide an indispensable guide for theatre students practitioners and historians indices cover designers productions actors and performers the iconography provides an indexed record of over 6000 printed plates of performers in role illustrating performance costume from the 18th to 20th century

iampolski deals with concepts and ideas that are highly complex and frequently very abstract yet his discussion and the progression of his analyses is always precise and easy to follow each of his points is grounded in a careful examination of a specific text and most of the texts are well known to american audiences vladimir padunov university of pittsburgh

many women artists throughout history have generated a brilliant heritage that has been suppressed and left inaccessible for scholarly or public appreciation and study this book provides a remedy by making available literary references to women artists lives and social milieu and more importantly citing illustrations of their work for serious study most of the references are drawn from unindexed sources in books periodicals exhibition catalogs and newspapers accompanied by an illustration guide that directs the reader to specific pictures for further study subjects include architects painters and sculptors since the renaissance

photographers recent artists in performance video and computer fields and related areas of feminist aesthetics references are annotated if they represent a major or only work of the artist in question

cubism was the most influential artistic movement that emerged in the twentieth century yet just what cubism was or stood for at the time of its emergence is still in dispute while the explanations offered for its importance for twentieth century art and its legacy for the present are bewildering in their variety this fascinating book offers a way beyond this confusion a narrative of its beginnings consolidation and dissemination that takes into account not only what the style and the movement signified at the time of its emergence but also the principal writings through which cubism's significance for modernism has been established visually stunning with over 100 illustrations this is an essential work for all students and teachers of modern art history

a catalogue of the collection was first published in 1987 but has been out of print for some time this new revised and expanded edition includes information on acquisitions since 1987 and updated biographies of artists covered in the first edition

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
